

## **Helford River Explorer**

**Leaving the Carrick Roads and heading South this inspiring trip takes you out past Pendennis & St Mawes castle, Black Rock, St Anthony Lighthouse and across Falmouth Bay before entering the world renowned Helford River, home to Daphne du Maurier's Frenchman's Creek, The Ferry Boat Inn and some of the world's most beautiful gardens.**

Leave from either Customs House Quay, Falmouth or St Mawes Harbour and enjoy one of the regular express services that land at Helford Passage throughout the day. From the sandy beach in front of The Ferry Boat Inn you can disembark and change for one of the regular ferry services that run between Helford Passage, Helford Point, Trebah Gardens, The Budock Vean Hotel and Glendurgan Gardens.

By buying a 'Helford Freedom Pass' that includes return passage from St Mawes or Falmouth to Helford Passage, entry to Trebah Gardens and an all day pass for the ferry services that run within the Helford River, you can choose your own itinerary. Spend the day as you wish and enjoy complete flexibility by combining creekside walks, ferry trips, tropical gardens, pub lunches and sandy beaches to make the most of this stunning area.

Make sure you book by calling 07970 24 22 58 to reserve your place aboard the 'Falmouth Bay Express' which runs from May 27th to Sept 30th between Falmouth or St Mawes and the Helford.
